Pastor's Ponderings -

Have you ever gone to Aldi for groceries, and as you walk over to get a shopping cart, someone gives you theirs because they're all finished? So you quickly reach out to hand them a quarter and they say, "Oh, don't worry about it." Or maybe you've been out for a wonderful evening with your 'better half'...a nice dinner or maybe a movie...but when you come out to the car to leave, you put the keys in the ignition and...nothing. Dead battery...so much for the wonderful evening. You look at each other and say, "Now what?" Just about that time, someone comes along seeing your dilemma, and says, "Can I help...l've got jumper cables." They pull up alongside your car, give your car a jump and you're good to go. (Just check that battery when you get home). You say, "Thank you so much", and try to give him a few bucks for keeping your wonderful evening intact, but he says, "Oh no, that's fine...don't worry about it." You insist, but he says again, "No really...don't worry about it."

That's a really nice gesture, and hopefully we've all had a chance to be on the receiving end of such a nice act. Perhaps, even more importantly, we have all had the opportunity to convey such a kind act to someone else. There are times; however, when this is not the way we want to respond to someone, and it's not the way we should want someone to respond to us. It would not be to our benefit, nor would it be to their benefit.

What am I talking about? I'm talking about sin, I'm talking about that little three letter word that seemingly fewer and fewer people want to think about, focus on, or talk about...SIN..."Pastor, don't talk about that, it just discourages people and brings them down." The problem is, just because we choose not to talk about it, doesn't mean it goes away. In fact, not talking about it and not dealing with it just causes it to get worse in, I think, 10 out of 10 times. You get my point! And it's even worse when someone says to us, "Hey, don't worry about it." Hopefully we would never say something like that to someone else with regard to sin.

Sin is taken way too lightly in our world today. In fact, in many people, sin is not regarded at all. Even more sadly, among many Christians, sin is not taken seriously. There is, (among many Christians and in the Church today) a very real attitude of, "Hey, don't worry about it." The truth is, we need to take sin very seriously. Just because it's "today", doesn't mean sin is some sort of really old fashioned idea that doesn't apply to us anymore. Our Lord and Savior takes sin very seriously. Our Heavenly Father takes sin very seriously. The Holy Spirit takes sin very seriously. We should too!

Sin is anything (whether in thought, action or attitude) that does not express or conform to the holy character of God as expressed in His moral law. Sin is human rebellion against God and against His standard. Our sin is why Jesus went to the cross, that through His shed blood we could measure up to God's standard as we stand covered in His shed blood, now trusting in the finished work of Jesus for the forgiveness of all our sins. Praise God that He is so willing to forgive and cleanse our hearts completely.

May we take sin seriously in our lives and not let it grow. Let's not let the enemy of our souls talk us into believing that sin is no big deal. Praise God that the wonderful grace of Jesus is greater than all our sin. But that doesn't mean we should take sin lightly! The only place to take our sin is to the cross, every day, because, in all honesty, it is a very big deal!!!








DON'T FORGET TO TURN YOUR CLOCKS <u>BACK</u> ON NOVEMBER 3RD




