Pastor's Ponderings -

The true meaning of Christmas is that Jesus Christ, God's Son, came to this earth to be born into the human race. As we gathered together on Christmas Eve, we considered the question, "Why did He come?" It's a valid question, and it's one we as Christians ought to have a ready answer for. Why would God want to come to this earth? Why would Jesus want to take on human flesh and become fully man while yet still being fully God? Well, there is a good answer for it, and I'm very thankful that there is. But as we look at that answer, let's consider two questions. First of all, do we know the answer to that question? And second, do we know how to give the answer, and explain it to someone were they to ask us, "Why did Jesus come to earth?"

Well, first of all let's answer the question: Jesus Christ came to earth to save sinners. It's as simple and clear as that. I Timothy 1:15 says, "The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance that Jesus Christ came into the world to save sinners." Paul knew exactly why Jesus had come into this world. There was no doubt or question or hesitation in his mind. Jesus Himself declares in Luke 19:10, "The Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost." John writes in his Gospel in John 1:14, "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth."

Jesus came to seek and to save the lost. Isaiah 53:6 reminds, "All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned – everyone – to his own way; and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all." If Jesus had not come to earth, we would all be without hope. And we would be lost for eternity. We would be condemned to an eternity separated from God. Romans 3:23 tell us, "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." But thankfully there is hope. We are not without hope. I Peter 3:18 reminds us, "For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that He might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the Spirit." And He rose from the dead. Jesus didn't stay in the grave, He rose again! He is risen! Praise the Lord! Acts 10:43 tells us, "To Him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in Him receives forgiveness of sins through His name." And Romans 6:23 tells us, "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Jesus Christ our Lord." And finally Romans 10:13 states, "For everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

So we have answered the question of why Jesus came to earth, and what it means to be saved. Could you explain it to someone else if they were to ask you what it meant to be saved, or why Jesus came to earth? Could you lead someone else to Christ? As we enter a new year, I am amazed by how fast time is flying by and thus fleeting away. In 2018 it felt like every week I was flipping the calendar to another new month. What should we be about if not pointing people to Christ as we see the Day approaching? As we enter 2019 let's give up our "small ambitions" and focus more on what's really important -

Know the Message, Believe the Message, Preach the Message, Live the Message



Senior Luncheon - Nancy McKinney's Fudge

Lightly butter a 9-inch square pan

3/4 cup butter or margarine

3 cups sugar (oh my!)

1 5-ounce can evaporated milk (2/3 cup)

1 12-ounce package semi-sweet chocolate chips

1 7-ounce jar Kraft marshmallow cream

1 cup chopped nuts (optional)

1 teaspoon vanilla



Mix butter, sugar, and milk in heavy 2~1/2 or 3 quart saucepan. Bring to full rolling boil over medium heat, stirring constantly. Continue boiling 5 minutes on medium heat until candy thermometer reaches 234 degrees, stirring constantly to prevent scorching.

Remove from heat. Gradually stir in chocolate chips until melted. Add remaining ingredients and mix well.

Pour into prepared pan. Cool at room temperature and cut into squares.

Notes:

You may use other flavors of chips, such as 12 ounces of vanilla or 1 ounce of peanut butter instead of chocolate.

Do <u>not</u> substitute sweetened condensed milk for evaporated milk.
