Pastor's Ponderings -

Jonah 1:1, "The word of the Lord came to Jonah." Question for you: What do you do when the word of the Lord comes to you? In other words, when God speaks to you, what do you do? When He has something He wants you to know, or do, or something He wants you to say, how do you respond? What about when God has somewhere He wants you to go, and you know you heard God speak. You know that God is speaking, you know it in your heart. What do you do?

Jonah ran away from the Lord when he heard the Lord speak to him. He went in the opposite direction, intentionally trying to get as far away from God as was physically possible. Well, that's not very smart, nor is it the least bit possible. We cannot run from God, He's everywhere. There is no where we can go that God is not there. Psalm 139:7-8 tells us, "Where can I go from Your Spirit? Where can I flee from Your presence? If I go up to the heavens, You are there; if I make my bed in the depths, You are there." But Jonah tried, he thought he could run from God.

Hebrews 4:13 says, "And there is no creature hidden from His sight, but all things are open and laid bare to the eyes of Him with whom we have to do." Jeremiah 23:24 reminds us, "Can a man hide himself in hiding places so I do not see him? Declares the Lord. Do I not fill the heavens and the earth? Declares the Lord."

Jonah ran and hid from God, he did not want to listen to the Lord when God spoke to him. Somehow Jonah thought it better to go in the opposite direction of God's plan. I wonder sometimes if Jonah really thought he could hide from God, or if maybe he was just looking for a place where he would not be able to hear God's voice calling him. Either way, his thinking was flawed. Maybe he was mad at God, that God was calling him to go to Nineveh and preach against it. Maybe he feared for his life in going into the Assyrian empire and preach in their capitol city. Maybe it was all of the above. But true as true, after lying in the belly of a good size fish for 72 hours, Jonah had a change of heart. He became willing to go and do as God had called him to do in the first place. Notice how, "The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time...Jonah obeyed the word of the Lord and went to Nineveh." Jonah 3:1-3.

Funny how 3 days of really bad accommodations can redirect our vision and our motivation, in order to help us see that doing things God's way, in God's time, is always best.

How is it with you today? Are you in line with God's call on your life? Maybe you're not hiding in the bottom of a boat, but are you listening to God? Are you letting Him tell you who He wants you to be? Do you listen to His plan for your life? It sounds like such a simple thing, but will you allow me to be so direct. Are you listening for God's voice? He wants to speak to us, but we must be willing to listen. Yes, we can run from God, but we cannot hide from Him. If we try, we may not like where we end up. We may not like how God gets our attention. How much better that we would listen to God's voice and heed His call, (the first time). His ways are best. God promises His Holy Spirit will be with us, to lead us and guide us, to speak to us and teach us. We are not alone. May we be a people for God, listening to His voice, and walking in His directives.


