Pastor's Ponderings –

As we enter April every year, and sometimes March, our focus turns to Easter. We think about the victory that is ours in Jesus because of the empty grave. We remember the cross and how Jesus suffered and died on the cross to pay the price for all of our sins. We consider the last words of Jesus from the cross in John 19:30, "When He had received the drink, Jesus said, 'It is finished.' With that, He bowed His head and gave up His Spirit." To know the truth, in the fact that there is nothing we can do to improve upon or add to what Jesus has already done for us. Salvation is complete in Jesus Christ. My works and my efforts will not save me, nor will my works or my efforts be able to add to, or improve upon the finished work of Jesus on the cross at Calvary.

But let's consider today 3 things that led Jesus to the cross. Luke 9:51 says, "As the time approached for Him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely set out for Jerusalem."

- #1 Jesus was absolutely insistent on His dependency upon His Heavenly Father. John 8:28-29, "So Jesus said, when you have lifted up the Son of Man, then you will know that I am He and that I do nothing on my own but speak just what the Father has taught me. The One who sent me is with me; He has not left me alone, for I always do what pleases Him."
- #2 Jesus was absolutely insistent on being obedient to His Heavenly Father in all things. He demonstrated His faith in His Heavenly Father through His obedience to His Heavenly Father. After all, what is faith if it is not a total dependence on God, and a willingness to do His will? It is complete and total, humble obedience to God's will, ready to do whatever He call us to do. And by the way, I don't know that we always need more faith. The amount of faith is not nearly as important as the right kind of faith – faith in a God who has the power and the victory. Obedience is not something extra we do.

It's what we're called to do. It's who we're called to be — obedient servants just like Jesus was, and is. With obedience comes more faith. I think sometimes more faith doesn't come, because we're not being obedient in the ways that God already called us to walk in. And what God is saying is, "How will I give you more faith if you won't first walk in obedience to the things I have called you to walk in?" Honestly, I think this is a huge problem in the church today — a desire for much faith, but an unwillingness or a stubbornness to walk in obedience in the ways that God has shown us to walk in. Jesus walked in obedience to His Heavenly Father's every word.

#3 Jesus finished what He started. Jesus finished what His Heavenly Father started in Him. He didn't give up. He didn't lose hope. He didn't quit part way through. John 4:31-34 reminds us, "Meanwhile His disciples urged Him, 'Rabbi, eat something.' But He said to them, 'I have food to eat that you know nothing about.' Then the disciples said to each other, 'Could someone have brought Him food?' 'My food,' Jesus said, 'is to do the will of Him who sent me and to finish His work." The grave is empty as to say with such a loud voice, IT IS FINISHED! Jesus finished God's work. There is victory for us in Jesus.




