Pastor's Ponderings -

"For consider Him who has endured such hostility by sinners against Himself, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart." Hebrews 12:3

"Let us not lose heart in doing good, for in due time we will reap if we do not grow weary." Galations 6:9

"But as for you, brothers, do not grow weary of doing good." 2 Thessalonians 3:13

"Therefore, I ask you not to lose heart at my tribulations on your behalf, for they are your glory." Ephesians 3:13

"Therefore, we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day." 2 Corinthians 4:16

"Therefore, since through God's mercy we have this ministry, we do not lose heart."

2 Corinthians 4:1

There are many things that will cause us to grow weary and get tired of doing the right thing. Life can be hard and overwhelming many times. It's exhausting and draining just trying to keep up with the things we need to get done in a day or a week. The drain of life can cause us to give up and lose heart if we're not careful. Watching someone we care about go through a difficult time can cause us to grow weary. We see this as Paul writes to the Ephesians that he is concerned for their well-being as they watch him endure the pain of persecution and imprisonment for preaching the Gospel. Galations 6:2 reminds us to, "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way, you will fulfill the law of Christ."

There are a lot of people we know and love who are hurting, or they're sick, or they just have a hard life; and it can be hard and discouraging to bear with them. We pray for them, and yet they continue to struggle. We can be tempted to want to give up, but don't do it. Bearing with them and continuing to lift them up in prayer is the right thing to do. We grow weary if we don't get sleep, if we don't eat right, and in general, if we just don't take care of ourselves. If there's sin in our lives that goes undealt with, if we aren't reading the Bible as we should be, if we're not seeking the Lord in prayer as we should be, we're going to lose heart. We will lose our vision, grow weary and lose heart if we're not walking with the Lord all the time.

We can look at our country, our elected officials, and be very tempted to be discouraged and lose heart. But we must not give in to the temptation to become discouraged. Now more than

ever, we must be diligent and devoted to prayer. The future of our freedoms hang in the balance. To lose heart and grow weary of doing good, is to get tired of doing the right thing. Under any of these seemingly overwhelming scenarios, and many others like them, we can be tempted to grow weary and lose heart. And yet in all of these Scriptures listed for us, we are called to do just the opposite. How is that possible when life looks so daunting at every turn?

Well, I believe the answer for us lies in several of Paul's writings, one of which we have already looked at...2 Corinthians 4:1. Paul declares that it is because of God's mercy that he has the ministry that he does. It is because of God's mercy that Paul was saved, and that fact so drove Paul's life. Because of what God did for him, he could do nothing other than serve Him with all of his life, and follow Him with all of his heart. Put simply, there wasn't time to lose heart. And even if there was time, Paul would have none of it, always remembering, and being so thankful for what he had been given in receiving God's mercy and being saved from God's wrath. All because of salvation by grace through faith in Christ alone. You see, it was the love of Christ that kept him going. It was the love of Christ that compelled him. Paul says in 2 Corinthinas 5:14-15, "For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died. And He died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for Him who died for them and was raised again." No matter how bad the day, no matter how difficult and discouraging the situation, it wasn't worth losing heart over because it never compared to all that Paul had been given and all that he had to look forward to in Christ. The difficulties of this world can never ever compare to the glories that lie ahead, and the hope that lies within us.

So, don't grow weary and don't lose heart in doing the right thing. It wasn't that Paul never had a bad day. He had plenty of reasons if he wanted to give up and quit. In 2 Corinthins 11:23-28 he lists some of those situations...he'd been in prison, he'd been flogged, he'd faced death many times. Five times he'd received 39 lashes, three times he was beaten with rods, and once he was stoned. He was shipwrecked three times, and once spent a night and a day out in the open sea, and many other dangers and difficulties too numerous to list. But, greater than all the bad days was this truth that promised all the good yet to come, and formulated all of Paul's reasons to press on: "God made Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God." 2 Corinthians 5:21. And so that's where he set his mind. It was his constant focus and grateful heart. It was his sure and certain hope that superseded whatever hardships the world was dishing out. In Paul's mind, this world was temporary...not only temporary, but very short. It would be gone in a blip. So, for the short time that he had, he wanted to spend it all pointing people to Christ. There wasn't time to quit and give up. Plus, with all that he had been given in Christ, knwoing all that Jesus had first done for him, he realized he could't guit. Instead he fully embraced who God had called him to be. That being; "And He has committed to us the message of reconciliation. We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making His appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God."...from 2 Corinthians 5:19b-20. Paul knew his position in Christ, he understood his calling in the Lord. Quitting or dropping out of the race was simply not an option.

Now I know you might be tempted to think, "Well, I'm no Paul." There was nothing special about Paul, it was Christ in Paul. And if you're saved today, then it's the Christ in you. It's not about us, it's about Christ in us. "Therefore if anyone is in Christ, they are a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come." 2 Corinthians 5:17. Paul knew this truth about God, and it's a good reminder for us; a good promise to stand on. "Now to Him who is able to do immeasurable more than all we ask or imagine, according to His power that is at work in us." Ephesians 3:20.

"Greater is He who is in you, than he who is in the world." 1 John 4:4. Don't lose sight of that truth.

Finally, from Philippians 3, "I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. One thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus."





Awana Club First Baptist Church Ages 4 yrs. to 8th grade






