Pastor's Ponderings -

What does it mean to be set apart for Christ? When your life has been set apart for Christ, what does that look like? It's not the kind of question you can answer in 30 seconds because there's a lot to it.

And before we can be set apart for Christ, and His purpose, we must first be In Christ. To be in Christ means to be saved. We must repent of our sins and trust in Christ alone for salvation. Jesus died on the cross to pay the price for our sins and be the perfection on our behalf that God demands. Jesus satisfied the wrath of God that is on sin. And, the wrath of God that was on us before we were in Christ. But, once we are in Christ, we are covered in the blood of Jesus, Jesus becomes our covering. Jesus becomes our righteousness, we are made right because of what Jesus did for us, on our behalf, on the cross of cavalry. And therefore, we are able to come into His Presence and stand before a Holy God. Having had the wrath of God removed from us by the blood of Jesus, we now stand before God covered in Jesus' blood. We are clothed in the righteousness of Christ. Jesus is the perfection for us that God demands. Because the blood of Jesus, God's only son, cleanses us and purifies us from all sin.

Now once we are in Christ, what does it mean to be set apart for Christ? Well I guess a real quiet answer, if there is such a thing, would be to say that if you are set apart for Christ, you are all Christ's - you are all His. You belong to Him. As Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 6 – "You are not your own; you were bought with a price." You see, when you came to Christ, and became in Christ, you then became all Christ's, All His, for His purpose. When you are in Christ, Jesus is your Savior. But! But, Jesus is also Lord of your life, not just the one who saves. Peter tells his readers in his first letter, the third chapter, "But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord." When a person comes to Christ, there is a change in mind about who Jesus is and what He had done for us. This change of mind should lead to a change in how we live our lives. If there is no change in lifestyle after a person has come to Christ, then one must question whether or not that person has set apart Christ as Lord in their heart. Not that we're perfect, and yes we still sin. But we ask Jesus to forgive us for our sin. And we should want to sin less and less. We understand more and more that our sin is the reason Jesus had to die for us and shed His blood. With that knowledge and understanding growing in our hearts, can we continue to sin so boldly and still think that we set apart Christ as Lord? I really don't think so.

The word, and the work is called sanctification. When we set apart Jesus Christ as Lord of our lives and Lord of our hearts, we are wanting Him to change us. We are wanting to be changed to look more and more like Jesus, and less and less like us. The word and the work of sanctification is the process in which God is making us more and more into the image of Jesus. Because when we are in Christ, we are a new creation. The old way, the old life, the old person is gone. And we are to be being made more and more into the image of Christ. We are now set apart for Christ's purposes, and will to be done in our lives. We don't live like unbelievers anymore, that old creation that we used to be is done away with. We have been made new by Christ. But when we live in things, and indulge in things like unbelievers, we don't live like we have a heart set apart for Christ. We are in the world, but we are not of the world. We live and walk like Jesus our Lord and Savior. And our holiness comes from Christ. In Him we are holy. Not only should we be set apart for Christ in our lifestyle, but we should be set apart for Christ in order to spend time with Him. God desires an intimate relationship with us, we need to be set apart for the purpose of spending time alone with Him. Time spent seeking Him. Time spent in His Word, and time in prayer.

Finally, let me close with this. Referencing once again, Peter in his first letter, Chapter 3:15, "But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have." Why would anyone ask you about you? Well, because you're in Christ, you're different. (Not better than someone else, that isn't it.) But different. And it shows. There is a hope, and a peace, and an assurance that maybe they don't have, and it's appealing. And so they ask, "What's different about you?" or maybe they already know that you're a Christian and so they ask, "What is so special about this Jesus thing?" And you have an answer. A very clear, confident answer because you are very sure of the hope that is within you.

You've spent time in prayer, time in His word, time seeking Him, and time getting to know Him. You know that God loves you and that He wants to have a deep, close relationship with you. And you are seeking to be more and more like Jesus every day and thus you have set apart Jesus Christ as Lord of your life, so thankful that He has saved you from the wrath of God and covered you in His blood. He changed your life and made you a new creation in Christ. And because of this, you are prepared to give an answer for the hope that you have, and therefore, showcase the Gospel of Jesus Christ. How can we do anything less than be set apart for Jesus? How can we do anything less than set apart Jesus Christ as Lord of our lives?

I pray that you are in Christ, that you know that you're saved. I pray that you know that you know that you're saved. I pray that you are growing in the Lord, being made more and more into the image of Jesus. I pray that in your hearts, you have set apart Jesus Christ as Lord.




Pastor Appreciation Month
