#### Pastor's Ponderings -

"We must do something about the cross, and one of only two things we can do – flee it or die upon it." "It is easy to learn the doctrine of personal revival and victorious living; it is quite another thing to take our cross and plod on to the dark and bitter hill of self-renunciation." A.W. Tozer

Our focus today is two men that we see in the Gospels. Our focus is specifically in the Gospel of John, chapter 19:38-42. Verses 38-39 say, "Later, Joseph of Arimathea asked Pilate for the body of Jesus. Now Joseph was a disciple of Jesus, but secretly because he feared the Jews. With Pilate's permission, he came and took the body away. He was accompanied by Nicodemus, the man who earlier had visited Jesus at night. Nicodemus brought a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about seventy-five pounds."

Matthew reports that Joseph was a rich man who buried Jesus in a new tomb that was meant for himself. Joseph made the tomb himself, cutting it out of the rock.

Mark tells us that Joseph was a prominent member of the Jewish Council. That he boldly went to Pilate and asked for Jesus' body. He bought some linen cloth and wrapped Jesus' body in it. He placed Jesus' body in the tomb and then rolled a stone against the entrance.

Luke says that Joseph was a good and upright man who had not consented to the rest of the Council's decision or their action. Luke makes special note to say that no one had ever been laid in this tomb, Jesus was the first.

John describes Nicodemus as a Pharisee, a member of the Jewish Ruling Council. A man who recognized Jesus as a teacher who had come from God. Jesus calls Nicodemus "Israel's Teacher". Nicodemus earnestly wanted to know what was needed to see the kingdom of God, and have eternal life.

So why all the fear? Why all the sneaking around after dark? Why all the secrecy about being a disciple? Joseph was a good and upright man, a prominent member of the Jewish Council, waiting for the kingdom of God. Nicodemus accompanied Joseph in helping with

the burial and the preparations for burial according to the Jewish customs. Why be so secret about your allegiance and your devotion to Jesus?

And why make your allegiance public now? Jesus was dead! You would think you would want to let Jesus know while He was alive that you were a follower of His. What good does it do to go public with your devotion now? To be two very reluctant followers of Jesus, private in their devotion to Him for seemingly all of His public ministry. I suppose today we would call it a "Closet Christian".

So what changed? Where did the new found boldness come from? And of all people, you now admit to <u>Pilate</u> that your allegiance is with Jesus!?

I know that we'll never know for sure what went on in these two men's hearts causing them to go so public with their devotion to Jesus. But of one thing I am sure, when a person truly comes face to face with Jesus on the cross, finally coming to grips with the reality that Jesus died for them, He died in their place and paid the price for all their sins, it changes the heart. These two men knew of Jesus, they were familiar with Him. They had even met Him and talked with Him. But their hearts were not truly changed until they came face to face with Jesus on the cross. At that point there was no more reluctance to follow Jesus.

How is it with you today? Is there a reluctance in your walk with Jesus? You may be very familiar with Jesus, having been in church all your life, but until you truly understand, <u>and believe</u> in your heart that Jesus died for <u>you</u>, you won't really change. In the church today, we have become so familiar with Jesus, that the message of the cross doesn't really affect us.

A.W. Tozer writes, "One of the reasons we exhibit very little spiritual power is because we are unwilling to accept and experience the fellowship of the Savior's sufferings, which means acceptance of His cross." What makes us think that we would ever be willing to take up our cross and follow Jesus, if we don't first fully believe that Jesus died on the cross for <u>us</u>?"

May the message of the cross, and the absolute truth of the Gospel, ring ever true in your heart and in your life. That you would be changed completely, and live for Jesus fully.


