# Pastor's Ponderings –

I love how the Bible is always teaching. There is so much to glean and be gained by studying the truth of the word of God. One of the greatest examples of what it means to follow Jesus is found in the life of Mary. Mary, the sister of Martha and Lazarus. All 3 loved the Lord dearly, all 3 were followers of Jesus. In what we have recorded for us in the four Gospels, Mary truly shows how she gives her heart to Jesus unconditionally. Let's look at her example to us:

- First of all in Luke 10:38-42, we find Mary sitting at the feet of Jesus. With everything else going on around her, a big meal being prepared, and a sister, (Martha) who was frustrated with her for not helping serve, continued to sit at Jesus feet in order to listen to Him speak. There were a lot of things pulling at Mary trying to distract her and get her to stop doing what she was doing. But she would not be moved. And Jesus affirmed she chose what was most important.
- Secondly in John chapter 11, we find Mary and Martha grieving because their dear brother Lazarus has died. Their hearts are breaking and they are both somewhat frustrated because Jesus is nowhere around. In fact by the time Jesus finally arrives, Lazarus has been dead for 4 days. Martha "lovingly" corrects Jesus for not coming earlier, and proceeds to "teach" Him that had He come earlier, her brother would not have died. While Mary, falling at the feet of Jesus, seems to be completely broken hearted, as if to say, "Why Lord, I just don't understand."
- And finally in John 12:1-9, we find Mary doing something that was completely misunderstood and highly criticized. It would appear that only 2 people understood what she did, and knew that it was the right thing to do. Those being Mary herself, and Jesus. In front of everyone, she pours an entire jar of pure spikenard on Jesus' body, and then proceeds to wipe His feet with her hair. This was a very costly oil filled with a strong perfume, imported from India. It was worth a whole year's wages. So a lot of people watching this unfold saw it as a huge waste, and thus were very indignant. And yet, in the middle of this beehive abuzz with criticism, Mary knew she was doing the right thing. Fascinating to me! A woman of her day was not given much credit. She wasn't the focal point of that particular gathering Jesus and Lazarus were. She wasn't seen as an important person. And widely criticized for her actions. And yet, Jesus defends her, and

makes it clear to everyone that Mary is doing the right thing, for the right reason at just the right time.

Are you desperate for God? Do you truly believe you need God more than anything else? Do you realize that you are absolutely lost without Him? Do you want God more than you want this pandemic to be over, and for things to "just go back to normal"? If you are really, truly desperate for God, you will be willing to get on whatever page Jesus is on and stay there. You may not like it. You certainly may not understand it, or be able to comprehend what God is doing. But who among us can comprehend the mind of God? You may not want to do it. But you will say, "Yes, Lord," and get on whatever page Jesus is on, in order to be a part of what God is doing.

I am absolutely fascinated by Mary's very "controversial" actions in pouring the oil on Jesus in front of a room full of men who criticized her. Still she continued, it did not matter to her. And she knew what she was doing. She was preparing Jesus' body for burial. She knew He was going to die. She believed Him when He told her that He was going to be betrayed into the hands of men, and suffer and die on a cross. She maybe didn't understand it. She certainly didn't like it. She could not comprehend it. But she believed it, and was willing to follow Jesus, even if it meant He was going to die. Mary knew what a crucifixion was. They happened often enough in Jesus' day that she had seen at least one. She did not want to see Jesus die, leave alone by crucifixion. And yet she was willing to say, "Yes Lord, I will follow you, regardless." Because she was more desperate for God than she was her own desires. Her desperate need for God outweighed her desire to comprehend the mind of God. What a lesson, what an example to us of what faith looks like. This is God's standard for what it means to follow Him.

May we follow the Lord fully. Whether we understand what He is doing or not. May our desperate need for God outweigh our desire to be able to comprehend the mind of God. His ways are higher than our ways. He is doing things that we cannot see or understand. Through it all, He is in control of all things.

We can trust Him.

We are looking forward to seeing you!





# YOUR DAILY BIBLE VERSE

## Which Book of the **Bible** Should You Read Next?



"All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness." – 2 Timothy 3:16

Sometimes my Bible reading is alive and full – somewhat like a scenic picture bursting with color.

And some days I simply don't know what to read or where to start. The mountain of words, verses, and books of the Bible bring rise to an overwhelmed stare.

A few books of the Bible rush to the rescue for situations like these. They help us grow. Consider the options below.



# 1. Calling New and Old Christians Alike!

<u>Twelve disciples</u> + 1 Messiah make for four fabulous Gospels. If you're new to the Bible, why not start at the beginning of the New Testament? Seasoned Christian? It's a solid review as well.

Allow the pages to flip to Matthew, Mark, Luke, or John. Start at the beginning, and work your way to the end.

Jesus answered, "The greatest is, 'Hear, Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is one: you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your strength.' This is the first commandment. Mark 12:29-30

### 2. No Time to Read?

Sometimes life's schedule fills with work responsibilities, kids' activities, workouts, a sick family member, and more. The calendar bursts at its seams. Bible reading becomes somewhat of a lost art in the mix.

In those times, what's a person to do? Consider a short book of the Bible, one containing six or fewer chapters.

Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, and Colossians are my go-to when the schedule overflows. They read with ease, packing power and applicable instruction in their short length. James,  $l^{st}$ ,  $2^{nd}$ , and  $3^{rd}$  John, the Peters, and Jude read likewise.

In their chapters, armor, unity, and freedom dance to life. God's love does as well. Encouragement to press on toward the goal cheers for readers. Rules for Christian households opens wide for acceptance. Everyday application awaits.

# 3. A Plan Sounds Great. Help!

You want a plan. You try to plan. You're simply out of time to organize a plan. Sounds like the perfect time to consider Proverbs.

Proverbs contains 31 chapters, one for each day of the month. How easy, right? If it's the 14<sup>th</sup> of the month, read **Provers 14**. Proverbs 15 on the 15<sup>th</sup>, and so forth. No bookmark needed!

The bonus? This method helps readers keep track of the date, 100!

What book of the Bible are you reading right now? What is your favorite book of the Bible?

Thanks be to You God, for your indescribable gift!


