

Pastor's Ponderings -

As we move into May and find April in our rearview mirror, it's a good opportunity to look at some of the lessons we find in the Easter account. And certainly the main one, the most obvious and most important one, the one we focus on is the fact Jesus rose from the dead. We are most thankful for this truth, and what this means for us. But there are other applications and lessons for us to consider in the Word of God with regards to the Easter account.

How much of what God is doing do we miss? Because we already have our minds made up as to what we thing God "should" be doing. Look at the two on the road to Emmaus. In Luke 24:13-35. They had their minds all made up as to what Jesus had come to do, and who Jesus was supposed to be. Therefore, they completely missed who Jesus was. They had lost sight of the fact that God had a plan, and that He was Why? Because it didn't match the plan they had capable to carry it out. predetermined in their minds of who Jesus was supposed to be, and what He was supposed to be doing. When we predetermine how we think something should go, or we get our hearts set on how God should do something, and then it doesn't go that way, we become discouraged and take our eyes off the Lord. The two on the road to Emmaus; verse 21, "but we had hoped that He was the one." Totally lost sight of what God was doing, and therefore, seemingly, had given up. Because what God was doing did not line up with what they thought God "should" be doing. We can become so focused on our disappointments, our frustrations, our problems, our losses, our fears, that we take our eyes off of the Lord. Funny things happen to us when our reality doesn't match God's reality. Here these two are, on the road to Emmaus, walking and talking to the risen Lord Jesus, and they don't even recognize Him. They're missing the greatest event in all of history; Jesus Christ has risen from the dead! Plus they're going in the wrong direction. In their discouragement and their preconceived ideas of who they believed Jesus was going to be, they're going in the wrong direction, thus shutting themselves off from where the fellowship is; back in Jerusalem with the other

believers. The strength, the encouragement, and the fellowship was back in Jerusalem with the other believers. So I ask the question of us; how often do we miss what God is doing? How often do we miss God's plan in our lives, or even stop looking for His plan, because we stop believing He knows what He's doing. Sometimes we forget, all too quickly, that God is still in control. And that He can handle it, all of it, all the time. We can trust Him with our lives.

Charles Spurgeon said, "You are not asked to trust in a dead Jesus, but in one who, though He died for our sins, has risen again for our justification." We need to embrace the fact that God's ways are not always our ways. But, He does most certainly know what He's doing.

There is the possibility, is there not, that as much as we say we believe God has a plan, we struggle to trust it. God's plan is better than our plan. God knows what's best. He has my best in mind. His ways are not always my ways. His ways are higher than my ways. But when it comes right down to it, we have trouble trusting what we say we believe, and what we say we know to be true. Right? I think that's why God uses interruptions so often in our lives. He wants to get our attention. He challenges us to trust Him for what we say we believe Him for. Jesus interrupted the two on the road to Emmaus to grab their attention. And aren't you glad He did. He interrupted their discouragement, their hopelessness, and their preconceived notions about who Jesus was. He interrupted the eleven as they sat in their room filled with fear and doors locked that first Easter evening. He walked right through the walls. Discouragement, fear, anger, hopelessness, guilt, and all the other things the disciples were feeling that first East weekend, needed to be interrupted in order that they could see the truth. Jesus wanted them to see and know and believe and trust the truth. So He met them right where they were. In order that they might believe and trust Him.

It's easy to become frustrated when God interrupts our plans. But He has a better plan. And sometimes His interruptions are His way of teaching us things, or protecting us from things, or just getting our attention in order to redirect our focus back towards Him. God knows what He's doing. All the time. We can trust Him.





A <u>Prayer</u> for Hard Days By Christina Fox

"Draw near to God, and He will draw near to you." James 4:8

We all have hard days. Challenging days. Days that stretch us, sometimes beyond what we can bear. Sometimes these days appear as a series of little irritating events that build up to one terrible, horrible, no good, very bad day. Other days we wake up to find one huge unexpected event that lands like a bomb in our life.

Sometimes those hard days find us busy and distracted as we try to fix everything that has gone wrong. Or we get so caught up in our thoughts and feelings about our circumstances that it consumes us. Or perhaps we attempt to hide away from the struggle of the day in the hopes that if we don't think about it, maybe it will all just go away.

Instead of such responses, hard days are opportunities for us to draw near to God. They are opportunities for us to rely on Him, depend on Him, and receive more of His Grace. Such days remind us how desperate we are and how much we need our Savior.

Father in Heaven,

Help Me! I am so weary and worn down by this day. So many things are happening all at once and I don't know what to do. I am overwhelmed. It feels like I am standing in a fierce wind that is whipping and swirling around me. I can't move; the force is so strong. It may just knock me down flat. And worse of all, what if I can't get back up again?

Father, I can barely lift my eyes to You. It's all I can do to cry out for help. Please extend Your Grace to me this day. Help me to see that You are in this and that You are with me. Help me to remember that You are not surprised or taken off guard by the events of this day.

You are God alone. Your word tells me that before time began You chose me to be Yours through Your Son, Jesus Christ (Ephesians 1:4). You set Your love on me and made me Yours. 
